Future Guardians of Cannock Chase

A new award and challenge badge has been launched in Staffordshire for members of Scouting and Girlguiding to get outdoors and explore Cannock Chase's landscape, nature and heritage.

The Future Guardians of Cannock Chase programme aims to boost awareness and appreciation amongst children and young people about the Chase, the wonderful national landscape they have on their doorstep and to encourage them to care for the environment. The hope is that today's youngsters will be the Future Guardians of Cannock Chase tomorrow.

The Future Guardians programme has 3 different activity packs. Scouts and Girlguiding have their own activities where they can work towards earning a Future Guardians of Cannock Chase Challenge badge; there is a pack to support young people who plan to complete the Duke of Edinburgh Award; Staffordshire Libraries have a full pack of Activity Sheets on their own website to download.

The resource content of the packs has been developed by environment education expert Amy Johnston. It informs, explains and inspires about the special qualities that define the area and create its unique sense of place (natural heritage, cultural heritage, landscape character and scenic qualities, tranquillity and wildness), its vulnerabilities, and how we can all get involved to look after it. This includes the core of the Chase designated as a Special Area of Conservation and of international importance for wildlife.

Councillor Victoria Wilson of the AONB partnership, advised "we need all our youngsters at every age to help us to keep this special place available for future generations. By working for this badge, sections will explore some of Cannock Chase's wonderful landscapes and find out lots of amazing facts. They will also learn how to guard this precious place so it stays safe for us all to enjoy in the future. "
